A Psalm for The Fourth Sunday of Advent, Psalm 80 Refrain: Turn us again, O God; show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.

And so will we not go back from you; give us life, and we shall call upon your name. [R]
Faithful shepherd of your people, as we look for the light of your countenance,
restore in us the image of your glory and graft us into the risen life of your Son,
Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### Collect for The Fourth Sunday of Advent

God our redeemer, who prepared the Blessed Virgin Mary to be the mother of your Son: grant that, as she looked for his coming as our saviour, so we may be ready to greet him when he comes again as our judge; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

#### Gospel for today, Matthew 1. 18-25

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: 'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel', which means, 'God is with us.' When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.

Come and share our short session for children and young people during our Sunday 10am service EVERY WEEK! This week, we begin the theme God is Love and the amazing news of Jesus' birth. We invite children of all ages, with their adults, to come into the Lady Chapel during part of the service, and share in A Godly Play (a short visual storytelling of scriptures, with wondering questions, stories, crafts, puzzles, and even

some acting for those that want ... for all ages to share together; then various age related activities). We've lost a few of our helpers recently and sadly we can't offer our fortnightly breakout session for older children/young people BUT WE CAN DO SO ONCE A MONTH!! There's a display in the Lady Chapel, if you'd like to find out more! Our Children & Young People website page has loads of activities to help young people get to know the person of Jesus.



Children's Activities in the Lady Chapel at Christmas – We'll be having our very own Nativity 'festival' with lots of different Nativity Scenes ... from Godly Play, to TLC, to St Michael's School. There will also be puzzle activity sheets, plus craft materials to make the Wise Men to complete your own scene.
