This Sunday is our Patronal Festival when we celebrate the Feast of St Michael and All Angels.

Holy Communion, Wednesday 27th September, 10am – A service of Holy Communion, in church. Refreshments after the service will be held in the WCC.

Tiny Tots, Wednesday 27th September, 11 for 11:15am Worship for babies/toddlers and their grown-ups; with a story, singing and instruments for little ones too! Join us for refreshments, fellowship and a chance for the children to play beforehand in the WCC, if you can. **We gather in the WCC and walk across to the Lady Chapel for worship.**

Prayers for our Community, Saturday 30th September, 9:30-10am – All welcome.

Grove Cottage coffee morning, Saturday 30th **September, 9:30-10:30am, WCC –** A fundraising walk as part of the *Great Big Walk for Herts* (12 charities walking the Hertfordshire Way in one day, each walking different sections). The Way goes right past our church, so walkers start here by 10:30am. We're hosting coffee/cake for them and our congregation, with donations to Grove Cottage, to welcome and set the walkers off. Please come and join us, it was a very positive experience seeing them off last year!

Harvest, next Sunday 1st October – We'll celebrate Harvest at 8am and 10am services. There will be a Red Bucket for the Bishop's Appeal, *Cracking Food Poverty Together*, supporting Mission Direct's work in Kumi, Uganda, by providing materially poor families with chickens: for a sustainable and low-cost food source and a new income stream, because they can sell some of their eggs and new chicks that hatch. Their first hatchlings are returned to the project so that another family benefits. We are also requesting food gifts for Bishop's Stortford Food Bank.
