## A Psalm for today, Psalm 119. 33-40

Refrain: My delight shall be in your commandments.

Teach me, O Lord, the way of your statutes and I shall keep it to the end.

Give me understanding and I shall keep your law;

I shall keep it with my whole heart.

Lead me in the path of your commandments,

for therein is my delight.

Incline my heart to your testimonies

and not to unjust gain. [R]

O give me life in your ways.

Confirm to your servant your promise,

because your judgements are good.

#### A Gospel reading for today, Mark 1. 14-22

Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news." As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him. They went to Capernaum; and when the sabbath came, he entered the synagogue and taught. They were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.
