

Holy Communion: Order One

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **All** Amen.

The Lord be with you **All** and also with you.

All Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

With suitable penitential sentences, the Kyrie eleison is used

Lord, have mercy. **All** Lord, have mercy.

Christ, have mercy. **All** Christ, have mercy.

The president says the absolution.

The Gloria in excelsis may be used, in this or another form.

All Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Collect and Readings

Either one or two readings from Scripture precede the Gospel reading. A psalm or canticle may be used. An acclamation may herald the Gospel reading. When the Gospel is announced the reader says:

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*. **All** Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **All** Praise to you, O Christ.

Prayers of Intercession

Lord, in your mercy: **hear our prayer.**

The Peace

The peace of the Lord be always with you: **and also with you.**

Taking of the Bread and Wine

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you **All** and also with you.

Lift up your hearts. **All** We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **All** It is right to give thanks and praise.

The president praises God for his mighty acts and all respond

All Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

The president recalls the Last Supper, and an acclamation is used

Great is the mystery of faith: **All** Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

The Prayer continues and leads into the doxology, to which all respond: Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

The president breaks the consecrated bread.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

All Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

The Agnus Dei may be used as the bread is broken

All Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us.

Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world, grant us peace.

The president says an invitation to communion. The president and people receive communion.

Authorized words of distribution are used and the communicant replies Amen.

Silence is kept. The Post Communion or another suitable prayer is said. All may say

All Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ.

Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.

The president may use a suitable blessing

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord. **All** In the name of Christ. Amen.
