What happens next?



Why leaves?


A tree is made up of the following:




Roots = this is what our school is already like and our current vision and curriculum.



Trunk = our foundation as a church school, with our values curriculum and child-centred focus, which holds the school together.



The leaves = All the things we do as a school to grow – this will be the focus of our vision in terms of what we can do to continue changing and growing.

These are your ideas for how we can grow as a school, so anything counts really! However, here are some suggestions:

- What would make our premises even better?
- What would make our curriculum even better?
- What would you love to see more of?

Don't worry too much about budget (although of course this does have a bearing on all that we do!) but be as realistic as you can. For instance, we are not going to build an outdoor, heated swimming pool!

What will we do with the leaves?

Following the INSET Day on 5th January, we will establish working parties to collate and sort the ideas into groups in order to create our new school vision. We will then share this with the school community and publish the vision ready for the next academic year.

From here, your ideas will inform our School Improvement Plan for the coming years, short and long term.

This is a great opportunity to shape the direction of our school in a real way and be involved in an exciting project.

You have the chance to make a difference to the future provision and environment for your child's education and those coming through school in the future.
