Collect for The Second Sunday before Lent

Almighty God, you have created the heavens and the earth and made us in your own image: teach us to discern your hand in all your works and your likeness in all your children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit reigns supreme over all things, now and for ever. Amen.

A Psalm for The Second Sunday before Lent, Psalm 104. 26-37 Refrain: I will sing to the Lord as long as I live.

O Lord, how manifold are your works!

In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

There is the sea, spread far and wide,

and there move creatures beyond number, both small and great.

There go the ships, and there is that Leviathan which you have made to play in the deep.

All of these look to you to give them their food in due season. [R]

When you give it them, they gather it; you open your hand and they are filled with good.

When you hide your face they are troubled

when you take away their breath, they die and return again to the dust.

When you send forth your spirit, they are created,

and you renew the face of the earth. [R]

May the glory of the Lord endure for ever; may the Lord rejoice in his works;

He looks on the earth and it trembles; he touches the mountains and they smoke.

I will sing to the Lord as long as I live;

A Gospel reading for Christingle, John 12. 44-50

Then Jesus cried aloud: 'Whoever believes in me believes not in me but in him who sent me. And whoever sees me sees him who sent me. I have come as light into the world, so that everyone who believes in me should not remain in the darkness. I do not judge anyone who hears my words and does not keep them, for I came not to judge the world, but to save the world. The one who rejects me and does not receive my word has a judge; on the last day the word that I have spoken will serve as judge, for I have not spoken on my own, but the Father who sent me has himself given me a commandment about what to say and what to speak. And I know that his commandment is eternal life. What I speak, therefore, I speak just as the Father has told me.'

Come and share our short session for children and young people during our Sunday 10am service EVERY WEEK! Almost every week – this week we all share in Christingle with children from St Michael's!

We invite children of all ages, with their adults, to come into the Lady Chapel during part of the service, and share in A Godly Play (a short visual storytelling of scriptures, with wondering

questions, stories, crafts, puzzles, and even some acting for those that want ... for all ages to share together; then various age related activities). We also have an older group breakout session on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month. **Next week we conclude our series** *Jesus starts work:* as a new year begins, we can have the expecation that God will meet

us and help us, as he equipped Jesus for his ministry. We'll ask the question 'Who is Jesus?' (Matthew 11. 1-6).
